#### Uruguay

Uruguay, a country deeply connected to nature, boasts a diverse range of landscapes and numerous tourist attractions situated within proximity to one another. #### Currency

Currency exchange in Uruguay is possible at any bank or exchange house. Major credit and debit cards are widely accepted. The local currency is the Uruguayan Peso.

#### Accommodation

In recent years, Uruguay has expanded its accommodation options. From budget lodgings, campsites and guests-houses, to five-star hotels with conference halls, golf courses, polo fields, swimming pools, spa and a full range of amenities. Other types of accommodation offering a wide range of services are tourist farms and natural hot springs resorts. Additionally, it is possible to rent houses all year round in coastal cities as well as in the rest of the country.

### Average temperature

Summer and spring varies between 21°C / 32°C

Winter and autumn varies between 6°C/ 17°C

#### **Communications**

Uruguay has an extensive telecommunication system. The country's telecommunications technology is 100% digital with broadband Internet service. The modern well-connected roads and highway system allows visitors to easily reach any part of the country. It is also possible for visitors to find free Wi-Fi spots around different cities.

## Suggested ports and destinations for cruises on the Uruguay River

The suggested routes are based in Montevideo or Colonia del Sacramento. For the embarkation and disembarkation of passengers, Montevideo has a modern port with the advantage of having an airport only 20 km away from it. Colonia del Sacramento has a commercial port specialized in passenger traffic from and to Buenos Aires, Argentina. Additionally, this city has a marina for private boats used for leisure by their owners. Close to Colonia del Sacramento it is possible to find another beautiful city located on the Uruguay River, this city is called Carmelo. It has a fluvial terminal specialized in passengers traffic from and to El Tigre, Buenos Aires, Argentina and apart form it in the same fluvial channel berths for private boats also used for leisure by their owners. To improve passenger connections Carmelo also has a small airport very close to the port.



The National Port Authority, grants the berthing of the ships in the period requested by the owner to allow the boarding and disembarkation of the passengers and crew members. In order to study these suggested routes for cruises, this document offers a detailed description of the port facilities and tourist attractions in the different destinations.





#### **Port Facilities**

#### **Passenger Terminal**

The Port has a specialized terminal for embarking and disembarking passengers. The terminal has a scanner, customs, and immigration controls.

Cruise ships have berthing priority for stays longer than 24 hours.

- Sewage discharge: direct connection from the ship to the internal Port of Montevideo drainage system

#### Colonia Fluvial Passengers Terminal - Port Facilities

#### **Passenger Terminal**

State of the art terminal which receives around two million passengers per year. It has a scanner, customs and Immigration control.

#### Docking:

the Port has three docks. The ocean going dock is protected on the south by a breakwater: The Ocean going dock has a total length of 146 meters, the coastal traffic dock is 115 meters long, and the Union dock is 200 meters long.

#### Marina Colonia - Port Facilities

#### Marina

Protected by a breakwater called "Santa Rita", this marina has 2 docks with a length of 220 meters and a capacity of 100 berths. This dock is used as a public promenade, and it is usual to receive boat races organized by Argentinean yachting clubs.

Enchanting city- wherever you walk you breath culture. Declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1995. Its houses, cobblestone streets, typical lanterns and sunsets recall the history, and offer a unique landscape.

#### **Tourist Attractions**

Historic Quarter of Colonia del Sacramento, Real de San Carlos, Plaza de Toros, Street of Sighs, variety of museums, Anchorena Park, Vineyards.

- Explore the historic center of Colonia by foot or golf cart.
- Visit a cheesemaker for a delectable cheese tasting experience.
- Explore Anchorena Park, a current presidential retreat.
- Embark on a boat tour around the surroundings of Colonia.
- Immerse yourself in a captivating Tango and Folklore Show, either on board or as a finale to a tour.
- Embark on a day tour to a traditional farm to gain insights into Uruguayan customs.
- Discover the bullring, recently restored. The Real de San Carlos Bullring, declared a National Historic Monument, was inaugurated in 1910 for the staging of bullfighting events, which were banned in Uruguay two years later.
- Discover Conchillas, located 50 km from Colonia, through an informative tour.
- Explore La Paz, Colonia Valdense, and Colonia Suiza on a comprehensive tour.





#### Carmelo Fluvial Passenger Terminal - Port Facilities

#### **Passenger Terminal**

This 240m² terminal connects passengers arriving and departing from El Tigre in Argentina to the city of Carmelo.

#### Services:

#### Docking:

the dock has a length of 118 meters plus a ramp that connects it to the terminal.



#### Marina Carmelo - Port Facilities

Protected by a breakwater, has an esplanade of 2315.5m<sup>2</sup> and a dock with a length of 676.6 meters with a capacity of 134 berths.

#### Services:

- Single phase electricity (220v/50hz) plus basic elements for connection.
- Potable water (to use this service, it is necessary to have a hose)
- Ramp with a width of 7.87 meters
- Toilet and showers
- 24 hour surveillance
- Camping facilities for sailors
- Sinks, grills, tables and benches
- Promenade accessible to the public

Emblematic of the "Uruguay Natural" concept: a place to relax, to try good food and drink.


#### **Tourist Attractions**

two ocean-going docks more than 200 meters long. The port yards have an area of more than 40,000m2 to accommodate services for passengers.


Fray Bentos is the capital city of the Department of Rio Negro, which emerged in the nineteenths' century under the influence of the meat industry. Here was installed one of the most important industrial establishment in the country, the internationally renowned Liebig slaughterhouse. Today it is a UNESCO World Heritage Site recognized as part of the Industrial Cultural Landscape.


#### **Tourist Attractions**

Industrial Revolution Museum, Liebig - Anglo slaughterhouse, Luis Solari Museum, Hargain Square, Young Theater, the waterfront promenade, Roosevelt Park Summer Theater, Constitution square, Church of Our Lady of Pilar, Bioparque M'Bopicuá.

- Guided tours to the Industrial Revolution Museum and the manufacturing plant.
- Historical cultural city tour visiting the most important sites in the city.
- Visit the local Microbrewery and taste the artisanal beers.
- Bike tour in Anglo's neighborhood.
- Church boat tour along the Uruguayan River
- Bioparque M'Bopicuá: 150 hectare reserve with a wildlife breeding station, an interpretive trail with native flowers and a historic area of great cultural value.
- · Las Cañas beach is known for its fine white sands bordered by native forest.
- Facing the river you can taste an exquisite dorado (typical fish) prepared in a variety of ways.







#### Nuevo Berlín

A small town which is one of the gateways to the Protected Area "Parque Nacional Esteros de Farrapos e Islas del Río Uruguay", system of river wetlands, islands and islets, which are flooded permanently and / or temporarily as a result of the flooding of the Uruguay River. From here can be seen the largest number of islands and islets of the protected area that concentrate a wide variety of vegetation.

Approximate distance from Fray Bentos: 45 km.

- Walking tour visiting the most important tourist point of the town.
- Ecotourism trail "La Yeguada" where you can see native flora and fauna and approach to the indigenous past through the archaeological site.
- Boat tours to the islands that make up the Parque Nacional Esteros de Farrapos e Islas del Río Uruguay.
- Honey tasting extracted from the protected area.
- Fishing trips on the Uruguay River.



#### Villa Soriano

Founded in 1624, the town is a National Historic Landmark due to its colonial period features and cultural attractions.


Distance from Fray Bentos: 70 km.

#### **Tourist Attractions**

Ancient but recently restored dock adapted to receive ships, the first River Station, the emblematic chapel with the only articulated Christ of the country, museums, murals painted by artists.

- Cultural and historical city tour visiting the most popular attractions in the village.
- Bike tour around the town to appreciate large and various styles murals painted by local and international artist.
- Boat tours to explore the many sights of the Río Negro River and islands.
- Birdwatching and Nature Tours by boat.
- Fishing excursions with local guide.
- Kayaking down the river.
- Timijú Workshop: native pottery classes with local artisans.





#### Piriápolis - Port Facilities

Protected by a breakwater, that also serves as a promenade accessible to the public, has 5 marinas and 2 docks with a capacity of 171 berths.

Piriápolis is located in an area covering over 25 miles of coastline with a variety of beaches. Inspired by the great European resorts of the Belle Epoque, the city was founded by Francisco Piria in 1809, a visionary man and alchemist described the area as "the spa of the future". Surrounded by hills, forests and beaches, it is also known for its mystical paths, the paths of the Qabbalah and inner Alchemist are chosen by the pilgrims to meditate or to connect to mystical energy sites.

#### **Tourist Attractions**

Rambla de los Argentinos, Cerro Del Toro, Pabellón de Las Rosas, Piriápolis Art Museum, Paseo de La Pasiva, Castillo de Piria, San Antonio Hill.

- Historical and cultural city tour
- Experience the commercial, pedestrian, and bike promenade to revel in the panoramic surroundings of Piriápolis
- · Piria tour: Explore the most iconic locations personally selected by Francisco Piria
- Visit to Castillo de Piria: Inaugurated in 1897 as the residence of the city's founder, it is currently open to the public as a museum.
- Visit to Argentino Hotel: Opened in 1930. In its time it was the largest hotel in South America.
- Delight in Punta Fría, a charming location renowned for both its fishing and gastronomic experiences.
- Visit to Cerro San Antonio: It is the most characteristic hill of the resort, 130 meters high; place where Piria placed the cornerstone of the city. It is ascended on foot, in vehicles or in chairlifts.
- Fishing excursions with local guide.
- Stroll through La Cascada Park





#### Punta del Este - Port Facilities

Protected by a breakwater, it has a main dock, 5 Borneo marinas, a boatyard for on-land boat storage, and 5 berthing docks for passenger cruise tender operations. Capacity of 541 berths.
